REVIEW OF 2002

This year marks the first time that Walter Brown is not reporting on the events of the previous summer's efforts at Bisley. I think we are all agreed that over the past years, he has done an excellent job of collating the results and providing us with interesting insights into the achievements of club members. It was with trepidation therefore, that I sat down to start writing this report (thanks to John Webster for proof-reading it and adding comments about Antony shooting on the wrong target!)

Whilst we have no single individual in the Club that really excelled above all others, there were a number of wins and high placings. Outside of the club there were many noteworthy events. Ireland won the National for the first time, breaking England's run of 38 years and as a result, the National will be held in Northern Ireland in 2003. To prove it was not a one-off, Ireland then walked away with both the pairs and the Individual Gold medals in the Commonwealth Games following the Bisley Meeting and then went onto secure the European Long Range Team Championship in October. During the meeting itself, scores were generally very high, despite the wet weather we were faced with.

At the time of writing, Emma Cannings our new treasurer, who was last seen digging trenches at Sandhurst, is finalising the accounts.

In May, members of the club gathered at Bisley to celebrate 41 years of the club's existence. Chris Watson won the 'Top Gun' prize and Tim Bevan won the 'Improvers' Prize'. In the evening, the numbers swelled for dinner where Steve Knox and Walter Brown were amongst those thanked for founding and supporting the club over the years. Presentations were made to Antony Ringer for his 3rd Queen's Prize and to Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds as coach of the School team. The following morning, members, wives and children shot on the Commonwealth Games clay pigeon ranges. Over the hill, Antony Ringer gave instruction on shooting at long range. By all accounts, it was a very successful weekend.

The Bisley meeting began as always, with the school's events. Following the Ashburton victory last year, Uppingham, under the guidance of Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds and Peter Warren, came very close to defending the trophy. After the 200-yard detail, they were leading by 6 points over Epsom. However it was not to be their year, and despite finishing with a total 3 points higher than their winning score last year, they were overtaken by Epsom and pushed into second place.

In individual events, **W Fry** won the Schools 100. He was joined by 10 others from the team - a great feat. **H Bower** was 5th in the Reserve, **B Yates** was 11th in the Iveagh and 12th in the Cadet Aggregate. Finally, **Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds** was 6th in the Schools Staff.

The Veterans match in the afternoon saw one of our worst 'A' Team placing for many years. The A team dropped 6 points, for a 244.30 which put them in 12th place, out of 54 teams. The B and C teams were higher placed (5th out of 31 and 5th out of 17) with scores of 242.21 and 236.21 respectively. In the Aggregate (which we remembered to enter this year), we were placed 3rd with a score of 723.73. The Public School Veterans has eluded Uppingham for 14 years (although we have had a number of second places in recent years) – it is about time we won it. There was one success that afternoon however – **Aniela Scattergood** won the Veteran's Tankard with a score of 50.8.

In the 'Lucas' for the aggregate of the Ashburton and Veterans A Team scores Uppingham was 2nd.

The winner of the Donegall Bronze Badge for 2002 was Aniela Scattergood.

During the schools meeting, the Match Rifle events were taking place over the hill. Nick Hinchliffe continues to further his MR career. In difficult conditions, he finished 4th in the Edge and 7th in the Any Rifle 1000 yards. A number of other OUs also shot the meeting, including James Watson who came 10th in the RG Aggregate. Subsequently, Nick's steady shooting throughout the Match Rifle events placed him 14th in the Hopton, good enough to ensure that he was chosen to shoot in the Elcho representing England – according to my records this is the first time Nick has shot in the match (although he has coached it a number of times).

As the Target Rifle events of the Queen's Golden Jubilee meeting got underway, several of our members managed to win a competition outright; most notable amongst these was the evergreen Chris Belk who won the Duke of Cambridge, repeating his 1975 victory in the same competition. That said, the number of top 10 placings achieved by members was down on previous years. Antony Ringer managed 10 top ten placings, and John Webster 8, in the competitions outside the majors. Four other club members achieved at least one "top ten" placing. There were 25 "top ten" placings in all, a number down on previous years.

Amongst the winners, as previously mentioned, Chris Belk won the Duke of Cambridge (27 years after he won it the first time). He also won the Stickledown and was 2nd in the Queen's Consolation.

Nick Harvey won the Times.

Antony Ringer won the Donalsdon Aggregate, was 2nd in the second stage of the St Georges, 3rd in the Century Range Aggregate, 5th in the LVA Communications Aggregate, 6th in the Fulton Aggregate, 7th in the Lord Tedder Aggregate, 7th in the Toye Kenning and Spencer Aggregate, 8th in the Northland Aggregate and 10th in the RPA and V-bull Aggregates. He was also in the winning Fulton Pairs team.

John Webster was 2nd in the RPA Aggregate and the Century range Aggregate, 4th in the British Open Championship and the Short Range Aggregate, 5th in the Fulton Aggregate, 6th in the Toye Kenning and Spencer Aggregate, and 7th in the V-bull Aggregate and the Donaldson Aggregate.

Simon Belither was 7th in the Duke of Cambridge.

Scores were generally high throughout the week – in the Donegall, there were 206 possibles with no less than 6 OUs amongst them (listed by number of V-bulls) – Simon Belither, John Webster, Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds, Antony Ringer, Aniela Scattergood and John Correy. Later in the week, 5 members (Nick Harvey, John Webster, James Watson, Simon Belither and Simon Osmond) managed possibles in the Times along with 144 others Nick Harvey won the competition keeping the cup in the hands of a club member.

In the Grand Aggregate, we had four members in the top 200; **John Webster** was 10th, **Antony Ringer** 11th, **Simon Belither** 27th and **James Watson** 186th.

In the St Georges, five members (Antony Ringer, John Webster, Simon Osmond, Simon Belither, Aniela Scattergood) made the cut for the second stage. Only 2 continued to the final – Antony Ringer was second after the second stage, going clean just one V-bull behind the leader. In the final, Antony Ringer was highest placed (36th) with John Webster 58th.

In the Queen's prize, we had six members reach the third stage. The cut-off was the highest score ever - 12 scores of 149 failed to get through with **Gareth Morris** being one of those dozen unfortunates scoring 149.16, good enough to secure 36^{th} place in the same competition last year! **Antony Ringer**, last year's winner had to tie-shoot for one of the last places. With 100 people separated by a single point (and 46 scoring a maximum 150), the competition was wide open. **John Webster** was the highest-placed member in 15^{th} , followed by **James Watson** 63^{rd} , **Simon Belither** 83^{rd} , **Antony Ringer** 94^{th} and **Aniela Scattergood** 98^{th} . Nick Harvey qualified to shoot in the final but was unable to be there due to another commitment.

Given that only **John Webster** and **Antony Ringer** had qualified for the final of the St Georges and HM Queen's Prize, the club championship boiled down to a shoot out between them on the final Saturday. Going into the Queen's Final, Antony had scored 1137 with John trailing him one point behind but with 9 V-bulls more than Antony. John managed to edge in front of Antony, when the latter struck disaster putting 2 shots (bulls) on the target he had shot the Georges Final on in the morning (not his allocated target in the afternoon!). Thus John went on to win the Club Championship courtesy of Antony's double miscue. Had his shots connected with the correct target, Antony would have won by two points. Final scores were John 1280.165, Antony 1272.151.

Simon Belither continues to lead the table of appearances by those still competing in both the Queen's 100 (23 – having only missed two years since 1978) and the top 50 in the Grand Aggregate (21 – equalling AG Fulton's all time 3rd place).

In representative team matches, **Antony Ringer** represented Norfolk coaching and shooting to help them win the County Long Range and the Victor Ludorum. In the National Match, **Nick Hinchliffe** was the main Coach for the English team and both **Antony Ringer** and **John Webster** shot. **Chris Watson** and **Gareth Morris** represented Wales in the same match. In the Mackinnon, **Chris Watson** and **Gareth Morris** shot for Wales. For the first time in a number of years we did not have anyone shooting for GB in the Kolapore.

Aniela Scattergood was in the Cambridge University team, which won the Chancellors and the Universities Long Range matches.

In Club team matches, our teams achieved limited success. We won the Marlingham having come second for the previous two years, and we were 3^{rd} in the Steward. The other results were as follows: Bank of England 5^{th} , Rifle Clubs 6^{th} and Belgian 14^{th} .

Continuing Walter's tradition, I have listed the number of highest possible scores (within the NRA definition) achieved by members of the Club during competitions at the Meeting. In the 2002 Meeting members of UVRC or the School achieved 51 (2001:51, 2000:35). Individually these were by John Webster (10), Antony Ringer (8), Simon Belither (7), Gareth Morris (6), James Watson (5), Chris Belk, Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds, Nick Harvey and Aniela Scattergood (3 each), Simon Osmond, Chris Watson, and Alex Williams (1 each). John Correy and B Yates from the school team also scored a possible each.

After the meeting, **John Webster** was Vice Captain of the successful GB team to Canada. The team won the Canada with a record score, only dropping 3 points in the entire team of 8 (John got 150.14). They also won the Commonwealth match, also with a record score and the inaugural America Match. John shot in both these matches as well. In the individual competitions, John finished 4th (and the highest placed GB shooter) in the MacDonald Stewart Grand Aggregate having led earlier in the week and won the Gatineau.

For the record, we should congratulate **John Webster** on his selection as Captain of the Great Britain Rifle Team touring the USA and Canada in 2004. He has appointed **Nick Hinchliffe** and **James Watson** as his Vice Captain and Adjutant respectively.

We would also like to wish the very best of luck to both **Simon Belither** in his quest to return the Palma Match trophy to these shores and **Nick Hinchliffe** in the Kolapore when they lead their respective GB teams at Bisley later this year.

THE 2003 BISLEY MEETING

The 2003 meeting will be held during the more usual weeks in July. Members should note that the Veterans match will be on Thursday 10th July 2003.

MISCELLANY

Four-year honorary members, and members still in full-time education, should note that, if they wish to shoot in the Bisley Meeting, the Club will help by paying half their entry fees to all competitions in the Club Championship.

The Club has a number of excellent 7.62mm rifles available for members to borrow. It is suggested that those who do so, and who can afford it, make an appropriate donation to Club funds. The rifles are normally kept in the NRA Armoury at Bisley, and members wishing to borrow them will need to obtain a permit from the Hon Secretary to produce at the Armoury.

Club sweaters and Club ties are available from the Hon Treasurer. The sweaters are in navy blue, embroidered with the school badge and cost £30.00. The ties are in the OU colours, with 6mm red and green stripes on 30mm pale blue stripes and cost £10.00.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 2002

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club, held at the HAC Clubhouse, Bisley, on Thursday 4 July 2002. The President, J C B Humphrey, took the Chair.

Apologies were received from E G C Allanby (Hon Treasurer), T R C Adams and Sir Ian J Wallace.

1. Minutes of the AGM of 12 July 2001

The minutes of the AGM of 12 July 2001 are published in the Club Report and were accepted as a reasonable record of that meeting. There were no objections. They were proposed by S Pattinson and seconded by J Watson.

2. Matters arising from the last AGM.

Unpaid Subscriptions. At the time of the meeting there were 15 members with unpaid subscriptions back dated over 2 years or more. The Honorary Secretary stated that with the exception of one member, they had not responded to any mail in the last few years. The Executive Committee had voted at the last ECM to strike SJV Osmond off the Roll for the same reasons. All past members may rejoin the Club in accordance with the Club Rules.

E Allanby was applauded for his services to the Club as the longest serving Club Official. He has been the Treasurer since 1987 and he was the Club Secretary from 1990 to 1999. EJ Cannings was proposed as the new Treasurer by S Belither and seconded by J Webster.

<u>Elected Members of the Committee</u>. S Belither became the President, N Hinchliffe hoped to stand down, and E Cannings became the Treasurer. CP Kelsey was proposed as a new Elected Member by A Grounds and seconded by E Cannings; A Scattergood was proposed by A Grounds and seconded by S Belither; and B Bullard was proposed by J Humphrey and seconded by D Mathieson.

6. Simon Wall's Donation

Some ideas were offered on the use of Simon Wall's donation, but everyone agreed that the initial strategy should be to keep the capital and to use the interest. The new Treasurer pointed out that E Allanby had made inquiries about tax and had found that the donation and its interest were not taxable. S Pattinson advocated how new members in full-time education would benefit from financial assistance for entry to the Grand Aggregate and the Friday competitions of the Imperial Meeting. Consequently the Club members were happy for the Executive Committee to make any decision about the utilization of the donation. This was proposed by J Webster and seconded by E Cannings.

COMPETITIONS DURING THE IMPERIAL MEETING

UVRC teams are entered in the following competitions during the NRA Imperial Meeting at Bisley each year:

The **Public School Veterans** - open to any number of teams of five former pupils. One team must be nominated as the A team; the team making the highest score of the remainder shall be the B team and eligible to win the **Dulwich** Challenge Cup for the best second team; the next shall be the C team and eligible to win the **Whitgift** Challenge Cup for the best third team. Two convertible sighting shots and ten to count at 500 yards. Five or more UVRC teams will be entered.

The **Public Schools Veterans Aggregate** - awarded to the School whose A, B and C teams together make the highest aggregate.

The **Public Schools Veterans Individual Tankard** - open to any number of representatives from each school and awarded to the person who makes the highest score in the Veterans. Entries to be made by individuals on the range.

The **Lucas** - awarded to the School whose Veterans A team and Ashburton team together make the highest aggregate score.

The **Marlingham Trophy** - open to any number of teams of five former or present pupils shooting the NRA Grand Aggregate of the current year.

The **Belgian, Steward, Rifle Clubs** and the **Bank of England** - open to teams from clubs affiliated to the NRA, and shot concurrently with individual events in the Imperial meeting.

RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

- 1. THE CLUB shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. THE OBJECTS of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. MEMBERSHIP. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 3-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
- Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.
- 4. SUBSCRIPTIONS. Ordinary members shall pay £12 a year, which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e.
- 5. THE INCOME and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- 6. PROPER BOOKS of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Audited accounts shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. THE OFFICERS of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.
- There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.
- 8. THE PRESIDENT of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club
- 9. MEMBERS will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. THE RULES of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
