REVIEW OF 2005

Normally, one can say that it was someone's year last year was not however a year in which one person particularly stands out. The Veterans teams victory in the PS Veterans Match was perhaps the highlight of the season.

At the usual March Committee meeting in London, the committee decided that in the interests of encouraging more of the younger members of the club to continue shooting, we would kick-off the season with a weekend training in March. The weather was not particularly warm but we had a reasonable turnout for the event and were joined on the Sunday by a number of members of the school. Overall, it was a successful weekend and everyone enjoyed themselves.

About a month later a number of the club turned out for the Purples match. The detailed scores are mentioned below but the team finished 16th out of 21 entries.

Hopefully we can continue to build on these club match teams and training weekends to give club members more opportunity and encourage the younger members to stay in the sport.

The School shooting team suffered this year with the departure of **Andrew 'Freddie' Grounds** to Greshams where he has taken up a position of shooting master there. As the school decided not to replace him, **Peter Warren** the School RSM was left to fill the void single-handedly for the best part of the season. As we are all aware, this is not easy for one person to do as the health and safety requirements and regulations have increased over the years. Since the majority of last year's VIII left the school it made a difficult year even tougher. As agreed at the AGM the club has written to the school to try and persuade it to address this issue but as yet, we have not managed to persuade it that it needs a shooting master in addition to the RSM. We will continue to try and help it see the light and a full report will be made at this year's AGM.

As mentioned, this year's school team was reasonably inexperienced as almost the entire Ashburton team from 2004 had left. This year saw the introduction of a third range to the competition and the cadet teams now shoot 2 sighters and 7 shots to count at 300, 500 and 600 yards. The school finished in 22nd position out of a field of 45. Detailed cores are listed below:

The school's Hundred changed format this year, it is no longer based on the scores made in the Ashburton alone. Instead, it is made up of the best shoot for each of the 300, 500 and 600 yard shoots on each of the two days of the meeting before the Ashburton. Henry Ives was the only team member to qualify under these new conditions.

Aside from the individual performances mentioned earlier, **Henry Ives** was 11th in the 600x aggregate and was 17th in the Cadet Champion at arms. **Tom Adams**, dropped down a place from his usual position in the School's Staff competition coming second.

As mentioned above, the format for the Ashburton has changed and so after lunch, having shot 300x and 600x in the morning, the schools shot at 500 yards. This final stage of the Ashburton was followed by the high point of the year for the club – the Veterans Match.

There was a good sized turnout and the club was able to field five teams. The A team score was not as high as in some recent years but the team managed a respectable 3rd Place. Team selection got the B and C teams the wrong way around but both won the 3rd and 2nd team competitions respectively. The D and E teams were 16th and 18th in the 3rd Veterans team competition. As a result, we won the Veterans Aggregate by some four points from the Old Guilfordians with a score of 727.73.

The winner of the Donegall Bronze Badge for 2005 was Ben Yates.

In the Match Rifle, four OUs again took part—**Nick Hinchliffe, Simon Pattinson**, **Robin Pizer** and **James Watson** (shooting TR). **Nick** continues to be competitive with a few top ten placings: 7th in the Wimbledon and 10th in the Any Rifle Aggregate and was reasonably well placed in a number of others. **James** was 6th in the RG Aggregate.

Early in the morning before the Imperial warm up events take place, the Astor is shot over 300, 500 and 600 yards. This is a match for county clubs and Uppingham Veterans represented the Northants, Leicester and Rutland entry. The team is limited in the number of class Xs who can participate (2 X shooters only) and so it is a good opportunity to 'blood' younger shooters in a competitive match. Uppingham put on a reasonable performance to come 14th out of 30 entries. The detailed scores are below:

The Astor was won by Manydown Rifle Club with a score of 623.80

Eighteen club members shot in events at the Imperial meeting matches as well as a few members of the school. The number of notable successes was down considerably. Only one member won a competition outright: **James Watson** won the Conan Doyle with a 50.4.

"Top 10" placings outside of the "majors" were up on 2004 with 18 (11 in 2004, 34 in 2003, 25 in 2002), Antony Ringer (10), Gareth Morris (3), John Webser and Chris Belk (2) and one each for Simon Pattinson. Chris Watson, and Simon Belither.

Antony Ringer was 2nd in the Friday Aggregate, 2nd in the Tucker Aggregate, 4th in the Queen's consolation, 5th in the Century, 5th in the Donegall, 6th in the Barlow, 6th in the Daily Telegraph, 8th in the Corporation, 8th in the Monday Aggregate, 9th in the Saturday Aggregate.

Gareth Morris was 2nd in the Elkington Aggregate, 3rd in the Palma Aggregate and 10th in the Stickledown Aggregate.

John Webster was 2nd in the Monday Aggregate and 6th in the Queen's Consolation.

Chris Belk was 5th in the Chairman's Prize and 8th in the Queen's Veterans.

Simon Pattinson was 4th in the Donaldson Memorial Second Stage.

Chris Watson was 5th in the Clementi Smith Aggregate.

Simon Belither was 8th in the Short Range Aggregate.

In the Grand Aggregate, six people finished in the top 200 earning NRA classes. Simon Belither was 40th, Chris Watson 53rd, Gareth Morris 58th, James Watson 64th, Antony Ringer 83rd, John Webster 110th, Steve Merton-Jones just missed the top 200 finishing 202nd.

The Queen's first stage this year was shot in very windy conditions, although there were considerable variations across the different details. Many of the club members that have appeared regularly in the second stage and even the final were knocked out of the top 300 this year.

Successful members continuing to the second stage were **Simon Belither**, **Chris Watson**, **Chris Belk**, **Steve Merton-Jones** and **Ben Bullard**. On Friday however only **Simon Belither** and **Chris Belk** made it to the final 100. **Simon** finished 11th and **Chris** 86th.

Thankfully, the club members were more successful in the St. Georges: Simon Belither, Antony Ringer, John Webster, Chris Watson, James Watson, Gareth Morris, Chris Kelsey and Steve Merton-Jones reached the second stage and Antony, Simon and John continued through to the final finishing 32nd, 51st and 67th respectively.

And so to the Club Championship; only **Simon Belither** qualified for both the St Georges and the Queen's final therefore winning the competition by 174 points and 51 V bulls – the biggest margin for a number of years.

In team events, **Chris Watson** and **Gareth Morris** were our only representatives shooting in the National for the Welsh team. The Mackinnon was won by England with help from **Nick Hinchliffe** as Main Coach and **Antony Ringer** as one of the firers, **Chris** and **Gareth** both represented Wales.

The Kolapore rather unusually, involved no Uppingham Veterans, something we can guarantee not repeating in 2006 as **John Webster** has been selected as Captain. Hopefully, there will be some Uppinghamiams shooting well enough for him to consider for selection.

Norfolk continue to excel in the Counties matches, Antony Ringer was an integral part of the team which won the short range match and was 3rd in the aggregate of the short and long range matches. Many other OU's played a part in various teams.

Uppingham took part in the Opening Shot, a competition for a team of four, shot on Ashburton day. A group of recent Uppingham school leavers competed in the Parting Shot under a cryptic team name

The club was beaten into second place in the Marlingham trophy by the old Malburians 10 points ahead, although our V-bull count was well ahead! Detailed scores appear below. For reference, UVRC were 7th in the Steward, 14th in the Belgium, 21st in the Bank of England and 21st in the Rifle Clubs.

Simon Belither's place at the top of the roll of honour for the Queen's Prize is only beaten by one other man in history; the late AG Fulton at 28 appearances is now only 2 ahead of Simon. Simon has however become the shooter to appear most times in the top 50 of the Grand aggregate with 23 appearances, and maintains his joint position at the top of those who have finished in the top 25 of the St Georges with a total of 11 appearances.

At the time of writing (due to the lateness of the report this year), I can report that **Gareth Morris** competing as one of the Welsh pair for the Commonwealth Games in Australia was placed 3rd in the Badge Match. More on this will appear in next year's report.

CLUB INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS

There are four individual competitions open as follows:

THE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (UVRC and School)

This competition, instituted in 1977, is designed to try to discover the best and most consistent shot in the Club or School in each year. The Championship is decided on the aggregate of scores in:

RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

- 1. THE CLUB shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. THE OBJECTS of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. MEMBERSHIP. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.

- 4. SUBSCRIPTIONS. Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year, which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
- 5. THE INCOME and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- 6. PROPER BOOKS of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. THE OFFICERS of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.

- 8. THE PRESIDENT of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
- 9. MEMBERS will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. THE RULES of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
