REVIEW OF 2006

2006 was a season which started late for the club. We were unable to put out a team for the Purples match and so the Veterans came together for the first time at Bisley on Ashburton and Veterans day.

Hopefully this year we can continue to build on club match teams and training weekends to give club members more opportunity and encourage the younger members to stay in the sport.

The School shooting team continued to suffer in 2006 season with limited access to ranges and the departure of **Peter Warren** the School RSM. Peter was a staunch supporter of shooting at Uppingham and spent many hours on the range helping the team develop.

The autumn saw the appointment of a new RSM (although he has already moved on) and more importantly for the team, a new shooting coach, Rick Shouler is an old boy from Oakham and has been brought in to teach shooting on a part-time basis. Rick is himself a GB shot and we are happy to welcome him to Uppingham.

More changes occurred at the school during the year, a new Headmaster has been appointed and I can report that he attended a UVRC dinner recently and was very supportive of the club and all its achievements. The dinner in March was well attended, and we hope to repeat the event in future years.

And so to the Imperial Meeting and firstly the schools meeting which is held at the same time as some of our club members are shooting the Match Rifle over the hill.

The new format of the Ashburton, introduced in 2005, continued with the cadet teams shooting 2 sighters and 7 shots to count at 300, 500 and 600 yards. The school finished in 12th position out of a field of 44. This was a huge improvement on the previous year (by some 74 points!) but still somewhat short of the leading school Epsom who finished 57 points ahead on 788 (with no scores below 30). Henry Ives shot the Spencer Mellish and was 16th out of 43 with 46.1. The Schools Hundred is now based off the two days shooting before the Ashburton. This year, J Rowley was the only team member to make the 100 (he was 99th).

Aside from the individual performances mentioned earlier, **Henry Ives** was 7th in the Marlborough Cup (snap) and 29th in the Cadet Champion at Arms. **A Hudson** and **Isobel Stevenson** were 43rd and 48th respectively in the same competition. **Tom Adams** continues to dominate the Schools Staff, winning the competition for the sixth time, four of them in the last seven years.

Following the Ashburton, there is now a slight break that allows for practice before the past pupils gather to shoot the Veterans Match.

As usual, Uppingham had a good turnout, with 22 members turning up to shoot. It was a fairly successful year with the A team being nudged into 2nd place by 2 V bulls. The B Team were also 2nd in the Dulwich Cup and the C Team won the Whitgift cup (the second year in a row for the club). Overall, these three teams combined to win the Aggregate by a clear 10 points (and 15 more V-bulls than any other team).

The Astor was won by Manydown Rifle Club with a score of 612.60

Eighteen club members shot in events at the Imperial meeting matches as well as a few members of the school. A number of club members won competitions outright: **Simon Belither** won the Alexandra, **Antony Ringer** won the Clementi Smith, and **Chris Watson** won the Prince of Wales.

"Top 10" placings outside of the "majors" were up on 2005 with 19 (18 in 2005, 11 in 2004, 34 in 2003, 25 in 2002), **Antony Ringer** (6), **Chris Watson**, **Gareth Morris** and **James Watson** (3), **John Webser** (2) and one each for **Ben Bullard** (his first) and **Simon Belither**.

Antony Ringer was 2nd in the Weekend Aggregate, 5th in the Saturday Aggregate, and 7th in the Daily Telegraph, the Duke of Cambridge and the Tucker Aggregate.

Chris Watson was 2nd in the Northland Aggregate and 10th in the Donegall.

Gareth Morris was 2^{nd} in the Berryman Aggregate, 7^{th} in the Prince of Wales and 8^{th} in the OTF Long Range Aggregate.

James Watson was 9th in the Elkington, the Howcroft Newspapers, and the New Zealand Aggregates.

John Webster was 8th in the Shearwater and the Lord Tedder Aggregates.

Ben Bullard was 6th in the Admiral Hutton.

In the Grand Aggregate, seven people finished in the top 200 earning NRA classes. **John Webster** 24th, **Gareth Morris** 61st, **James Watson** 76th, **Antony Ringer** 82nd, **Ben Bullard** 106th, **Chris Watson** 122nd, **Simon Belither** 132nd.

The Queen's first stage was a year of mixed fortunes. Six members were successful, progressing to the second stage: Chris Watson, John Webster, Ben Bullard, Steve Merton Jones, Antony Ringer and Gareth Morris. Simon Belither missed out for the first time in over 10 years – in all of which he has made the Final! Four of the six then qualified for the final – Antony, Steve, Chris and John. In the Final, Chris was 29th. Steve 56th. John 87th and Antony 97th.

In the St Georges, eight members shot well enough to make the second stage, although the highest placed in the first stage was **Steve Merton Jones** in 128th position. Others included **Simon Belither**, **Rob Clarke**, **Gareth Morris**, **Chris Watson**, **James Watson** and **Henry Ives** (one of the school). The second stage allowed a number of them to improve their standings with **Simon Belither** taking 7th place.oth the **Watson** brothers also qualified for the final. **Simon** finished 11th overall with **James** also Xing himself in 45th place, **Chris** followed in 60th place.

The Club Championship cup has a new name on it. **Chris Watson** was the only member to qualify for both the St. George's and the Queen's finals and so walked away with a lead of 137 points. **Simon Belither** conceded 50 points in the first shoot by not attending the Veterans match – another good reason to make sure you attend!

In team events, **Chris Watson** and **Gareth Morris** represented Wales in the National Match, **Antony Ringer** took on a coaching position for England and **James Watson** achieved the top Score on the range for England with a 105.14. England won the match by some 12 points from Scotland. The Mackinnon was also won by England which included **Antony** as one of the firers, **Chris** and **Gareth** both represented Wales.

John Webster captained the successful Great Britain Kolapore team winning by a margin of 12 points from Canada. He was able to include **Nick Hinchliffe** as Main Coach and **Antony Ringer** as Reserve.

Several of the club shot for their county teams but none of the teams featured in podium finishes.

Uppingham took part in the Opening Shot, a competition for a team of four, shot on Ashburton day and used as a warm up for the meeting. The team now has restrictions on the number of X classes so with a mixed performance, the team finished 18th out of 36. A group of recent Uppingham school leavers competed in the Parting Shot (shot on Century whilst the big guns compete over the hill in the Mackinnon) under a team with no name!

The club had a poor year in the concurrent matches, perhaps reflecting that the many of those competing are class X (and we are only allowed 2 Xs in the teams) leaving few to make up the other half of the team. We were not listed in the Steward, 27^{th} in the Bank of England, 33^{rd} in the Belgian and 35^{th} in the Rifle Clubs. Our only reasonable performance was second place in the Marlingham trophy (again) to the Old Guildfordians by 2 points, although our V-bull count was well ahead! Detailed scores appear below.

Following last years successful trip to Canada where they were part of a GB team that won all the international matches and most of the individual trophies, three of the club are to represent Great Britain in Canada in the Palma Matches – **Nick**, **James**, and **Gaz Morris**.

Chris Watson has won his first GB cap, being selected to go to South Africa in the spring of 2008.

Simon Belither still holds the top place in the roll of honour for the Queen's Prize although he is being chased by Paul Kent who is now one behind. Likewise, he also holds the top slot in the top 50 of the Grand aggregate with 23 appearances, one appearance more than Danny Coleman. However, he has now moved to the top of those who have finished in the top 25 of the St Georges with a total of 12 appearances.

The Commonwealth Games – A Welsh perspective from Gareth Morris

I was fortunate enough to be selected for Wales to compete in the 2006 Commonwealth Games, which were held in Melbourne last March. Being picked was a little bit unexpected; I had shot the trials back in 2001 for the Manchester Games and managed a disappointing ninth, so while I was expecting to do better a second time around, I didn't think that I was going to make it through to the final trial in September 2004. These initial thoughts were confirmed by a poor score in the first trial under very difficult and blustery conditions, but after a much better shoot at the BCRC Meeting in July, I had picked up a little confidence, and after the Imperial meeting I was leading the pack by seven points over my nearest rival and eventual partner Alexander Woodward. After the fifth trial, the only other triallist who could beat me was Woody, so I had won myself one of the two slots to go to Melbourne in 2006.

I was completely elated by the achievement. After any number of years of mediocre performance with very occasional triumphs, I had really started to get my shooting back on track. What really made the difference was the blinding flash of the obvious that all I had to do was to work out what I was doing wrong, and then stop doing it. It is a shame that I took ten years of competitive fullbore shooting to come to this conclusion; I was pulling the trigger at an angle, too quickly and snapping through the second pressure, which was throwing the shot off line at the last instant, even if my hold was very tight. Shooting with a SCATT on a regular basis helped me to work this out, and is something that I would recommend to anyone who wishes to improve.

The following eighteen months saw me shoot far more than in previous seasons and, in addition to live firing, I tried to shoot at least thirty shots on a SCATT each week, particularly during the winter months. In March 2005, Woody and I travelled to the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships, where were held on the Wellsford Range in Bendigo, as the Games themselves would be. While we did not achieve spectacular results, we each had podium places in one or two of the smaller competitions, and Woody took the trophy for the highest placed under 25 in the Grand Aggregate. Slightly pleased, we came back to the UK for the start of another season; although we needed to raise our game to be competitive with the big boys.

Both Alexander and I have employers who were sympathetic to our cause, so there was no problem getting the time off to go to Australia. Accenture actually gave me some financial sponsorship, and as a result I was interviewed for a number of in-house publications and spent some time with the HR department ostensibly explaining how I achieved work-life balance; I worked during the week and shot at Bisley during the weekends. They didn't seem to be hugely impressed at my spending less than one day a fortnight at my own home in London, so that particular interview never got published. Woody was also asked for interviews, but of a different kind and for different reasons, his grandfather being very well known worldwide in the music business. After a slightly unnerving interview with a newspaper he very wisely (in my opinion) left well alone.

It seemed very soon afterwards that I was sat at home with a huge amount of Team Wales kit, two large bags and a list of additional items that I needed to pack for the flight the following day. Even the flights themselves seemed to pass very quickly, and the two days of travelling soon came to an end when we moved into our house in the Athletes' Village. While we were there, we felt a strange compulsion to fit in and exercise regularly, so we both started to go running each morning. Very fortunately we moved out again two days later, when we went up to stay in the All Seasons Hotel seventy miles away in Bendigo. Surrounded by equally unhealthy rifle shooters, there was little further sense that we needed to justify our presence there and pretend to the title of "Athlete."

After two weeks of more or less continuous practice, the Badge Match was held as a warm up for both the shooters and the range staff. Consisting of two sighters and ten to count at 300, 500 and 600 yards in the morning followed by two sighters and fifteen to count at 900 and 1000 yards in the afternoon, it would be a long day for all concerned. A smooth day's shooting lead to an outright win for Adam Jory of Guernsey on 296.35 with his brother Peter and I tied for silver with 295.29 each. In the tie shoot, I fired a very poor first sighter and then lost my first and second to count into the inner, but Peter fired an excellent 25.2 to take the silver, leaving me with 23.3 and the bronze. Several of the team hierarchy had driven up from Melbourne to watch us compete, so I'd at least given them a good show for the day.

The opening ceremony was looming large, and after a certain amount of weighing the pros and cons. most teams decided to go to the opening ceremony and get a bus back up to Bendigo the same night. Unfortunately, the timing of the buses the following day was such that most people had the choice of a good night's sleep in the village and missing most of the following day's shooting, or getting to bed very early in the morning, but having the opportunity to practice as normal. The opening ceremony itself is one of the highlights of the Commonwealth Games, particularly for those who are competing in the games for the first time; the journey round the stadium with 80,000 spectators cheering. clapping and taking flash photographs is a heart-pounding and bewildering experience. For the first time ever, the home nations trouped out together, and once clear of the

ramp down into the stadium, there was a certain amount of mingling going on to get photographs with friends from other teams. Attempting to chat up the extremely attractive young ladies who had lead each of the teams out also appeared to be a popular pastime.

After a further three days of practice, the first of the matches arrived. The pairs competition is based on a Queen's second stage and a Queen's final shot in a single day, with each shooter being allowed to coach the other. Early conditions looked promising; with very little wind, but by message one at 300 yards there was a right-hand wind which could be a little tricky to read. The top shooters demonstrated their ability to raise their game when it mattered most, and at lunchtime England, Guernsey, New Zealand and Australia had all dropped only



a single point apiece. The England Pairing of Glyn Barnett and Parag Patel managed an outstanding 299.47 ex 300.60, with Parag putting in a perfect 50.10 at 500 yards. Lunch was a slightly tense affair, with some people kicking themselves for early mistakes due to nerves.

Moving back to the long range, the wind repeated its earlier trick of swinging through zero with enough strength to take the shot into the magpie. The most successful strategy seemed to be to wait until the wind swung back round from the right. Tricky conditions continued back at 1000 yards, with sudden gusts requiring up to seven minutes right, compared to an average of only three minutes. Parag Patel, coached by Glyn Barnett, managed the only possible on the range to take the gold for England, a point ahead of Australia. Malaysia took bronze.

Woody and I had a very nervous start and only managed 293.40 ex 300.60 at short range, putting us at a considerable disadvantage; we did shoot better at long range but finished up in 12th place on 582.71 which we were a little disappointed with. After a brief interview with a BBC camera crew, which unsurprisingly was never broadcast, we headed off to clean our rifles.

The individual competition comprises a full Queen's Prize course of fire, with the short and long ranges being spread over two days. Fortunately, the practices before the start of the games proper had very sensibly been rescheduled so that there would be the opportunity to practice at both long and short ranges in the morning and afternoon. The light conditions on Wellsford range are very dependent on the time of day, with the morning light coming from 1 o'clock behind the butts, and a significant change in conditions in the afternoon, as the sun swings round in front of the target faces. As with the pairs match, there were a few shaky starts from nervous shooters; however the conditions were relatively easy for 300 and 500 yards. Moving back to the 600 yards distance of the Queen's 1st stage and a number of shooters got badly caught when the wind started to shift significantly. In the afternoon, the winds continued to be tricky, and only Bruce Scott of Australia and Parag Patel of England completed the day with a clean slate.

With a practice day between the long and short ranges, many shooters elected to recheck their zeroes the next day. They were all in for a bit of a shock. The relatively benign wind that they had got used to had become something more malicious, with rapid and significant shifts in both angle and velocity, throwing shots into the wide inner and magpie. Many left the range making strange and terrible predictions about the short range scores being swamped by a hurricane of magpies. The night was a sober one. The hopes of many of the lower ranked shooters to make up a few points on the leaders weren't to be realised; the weather was clear and the winds were eminently readable as the crowds trouped into watch the final. With the prophets of doom and hope dispelled, the scoring was very high and as a result there were only a minor rearrangement of the standings.

Gold - Bruce Scott (Aus) 403.60 Silver - Parag Patel (Eng) 402.57 Bronze - James Corbett (Aus) 401.57 The medals ceremony anthem rang out again, predictably followed by "Advance Australia Fair" in a ritual which was repeated endless over the ten days of the games. It was the sound of inevitability: however no

one begrudged Bruce the medal which he had earned with some fine shooting. Again, my short range had let me down and although I'd managed a satisfying 148.16 at long range, I ended up on 397.43 in 15th place.

On a final note, I would like to talk about the enormous sense of friendship that I saw between competitors, and not just in fullbore; I spent some time with the Welsh smallbore shooters, and they introduced me to friends from very many of the other nations. This held equally true for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, when I swapped pin badges with athletes from Pakistan, India, New Zealand and probably half a dozen other nations. There was a feeling of being involved in something very exciting and with enormous momentum, along with thousands of other people who had worked enormously hard to get where they were. Unfortunately, time is relative, and the experience ends much sooner that one would anticipate, leaving you with a large quantity of branded sportswear, unique memories and a real desire to do it all again. Roll on the next trials and hopefully Delhi 2010.

RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

- 1. THE CLUB shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. THE OBJECTS of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. MEMBERSHIP. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.

- 4. SUBSCRIPTIONS. Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year, which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
- 5. THE INCOME and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- 6. PROPER BOOKS of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. THE OFFICERS of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.

- 8. THE PRESIDENT of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
- 9. MEMBERS will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. THE RULES of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
