REVIEW OF 2007

In March, many of the club gathered for a dinner at Uppingham. The dinner was a celebration of the successes the club has had over the recent years and was a great success in its own right. The Club's Executive committee had met in the afternoon (and the occasion of the dinner resulted in the largest turnout of committee members in years). The dinner looks like being something we will try to make into an annual event and once the school's mini-range is reopened (expected at the end of March this year) following its extensive refurbishment, we expect to be able to host a club vs. pupils match. James Watson and **Simon Pattinson** travelled to Barry Buddon near Dundee for the Scottish Open Championships and the Lawrence Match in June. Simon was captain of the England team which won the match by a mere V-bull. **James** was one of the shooters and also won the Grand Aggregate shot over the weekend.


Unable to put out a team for either the Purples Match this year, the Veterans Match was to be the first match for the club. We did not generally excel; our A team achieved their worst score and placing in recent memory and the C team soundly beat those selected for the B team, and so ending up in second place in the second team competition. Despite these performances, we finished 2nd in the Aggregate (some 20 points behind Epsom and 5 points above third place!).

As a club, we did win the Marlingham trophy from the Elizabethans Blue team by some 12 points. Detailed scores appear below.

We were 2nd in the Belgian, 4th in the Steward, 6th in the Bank of England, and 11th in the Rifle Clubs.

Individually, we had a good number of members (21) shooting the meeting as well as 3 from the school. A number of them appeared on the Grand Aggregate Leader board throughout the week. although only two made the St Georges Final and a solitary member shot in the Queen's Final.

A handful of members - Nick Hinchliffe, John Webster, Robin Pizer, Simon Pattinson and James Watson shot in some or all of the Match Rifle competitions.

The number of trophies won this year was lower than normal. Gareth Morris won the Sunday Aggregate (his second time), and a day later, James Watson won the Monday Aggregate. John Webster won the Howard Wilkinson. Perhaps one of the more successful members was Nick Hinchliffe who has now fitted a scope to his rifle and was shooting F class - he won the Alexandra, the Corporation and the Donegall, narrowly missing out for second place in the Lovell.

Members who took top ten places included:

James Watson was 2nd in the RG Aggregate, 4th in the OTF Long Range Aggregate and 5th in the Berryman Aggregate.

John Webster was 2nd in the Queen's Consolation, 4th in the Stickledown, and 8th in the RG Aggregate during the Match Rifle Week.

Antony Ringer was 3rd in the Five Hundred Yard Aggregate, 5th in the Wednesday Aggregate and 9th in the Daily Telegraph.

Chris Belk was 5th in the Veterans Aggregate, 6th in the Queen's Veterans, and 9th in the Daily

Chris Watson was 10th in the Donegall and the Five Hundred Yards Aggregate.

Gareth Morris was 4th in the TWP Designs Sighter Aggregate.

Freddie Grounds was 10th in the O Class Chairman's Prize Qualifier.

Freya Hinson was 7th in the T class Chairman's Prize Qualifier.

Simon Belither was 6th in the Berryman Aggregate.

Ben Bullard was 5th in the Times.

Nick Hinchliffe finished in the top 5 in almost all of his competitions shooting F Class RG.

The Grand Aggregate finished with 9 of the club making the top 200 – **Antony Ringer** 11th, **James Watson** 24th, **Gareth Morris** 38th, **Chris Watson** 57th, **Simon Belither** 82nd, **Rob Clarke** 124th, **John Webster** 132nd, **Ben Bullard** 153rd, and **Chris Belk** 167th.

The St Georges saw 9 club members qualifying for the second stage (Ben Bullard, Freddie Grounds, Rob Clarke, Freya Hinson, James Watson, Simon Belither, Antony Ringer, Alex Williams and Chris Belk). Ben and Freddie went on to make the final finishing 25th and 30th respectively.

In the Queen's Prize, 8 made it to the second stage (Chris Watson, James Watson, Simon Belither, Chris Belk, Alex Williams, Antony Ringer, Steve Merton-Jones and Chris Kelsey) but only Chris Watson made the required score for the Final and finished up 31st.

In the team matches, **Antony Ringer** was part of the winning Norfolk team in the County Short Range match, and the Victor Ludorum and second in the County Long Range match.

Chris Watson and Gareth Morris continue to represent Wales in both the National and the MacKinnon matches. Simon Pattinson was the Captain of the England team that won the National (for the 100th time), his Adjutant was James Watson, Nick Hinchliffe was the Chief Coach, Simon Belither and Antony Ringer were coaches, Alex Williams, Ben Bullard and Rob Clarke were reserves. James Watson and Antony Ringer also shot for the winning England team in the Mackinnon. Nick Hinchliffe was main coach for England in the Mackinnon and for Great Britain in the Kolapore.

The Club Championship was interesting this year as no club member managed to qualify for all the second and Final stages of the St George's and the Queen's. **Chris Watson** was the only person in the Queen's Final and so with an extra 150 points of opportunity, took the trophy for the second year running.

For a number of the club, the highlight of the year was yet to come. **Nick Hinchliffe**, **James Watson** and **Gareth Morris** were in the squad of 26 that travelled to Canada to compete in the World Long Range Championships. The team competed in the Canadian Championships, winning the Canada and Commonwealth matches for Great Britain before the Individual World Championships. In the Palma Match, GB set a number of records including not dropping a point at 700m. **Nick** was the main coach for the Match, **James** was one of the sixteen shooters and **Gareth** was first reserve. **John Webster** oversaw the match in his capacity of Match Referee.

Back in the UK, **James Watson** won the City Rifle Club Open, the Surrey Open (for a second successive year) and was second in the London & Middlesex RA Open.

In 2008 **Chris Watson** is travelling with Great Britain to South Africa, **John Webster** captains the England team to the USA with **James Watson** as his vice, **Nick Hinchliffe** the main coach and **Alex Williams** as a member of the team. **Simon Belither** is captain of England for the MacKinnon.

The National Match 2007 - a personal view by Simon Pattinson (photographs courtesy of Graeme Clarke)

It all began at the 2006 Umbrella Tent Auction of Promises. Webbie and Hinch were busy conning cash off the floor, when I was tapped on the shoulder.- "I am chairman of the English Twenty Club and the Council has asked me to find out if you would be willing to take on the captaincy of the English National Team." I now know the true meaning of being gob smacked. It is a pity that there was not a camera around at that moment. I stammered out my acceptance and Tom Rylands disappeared.

Within ten minutes, I had James Watson as my adjutant. Nick Hinchliffe accepted the chief coach's job within hours. Days later, Jon Underwood, the Queen's Prize winner, was appointed to be number one of my twenty – he scored the only 105 in the National match. I had the foundations laid for my team with just a bit of Uppinghamian influence!

England uses the match as a stepping-stone for up and coming shots to begin their senior international shooting. Of my team of twenty, at least five had to be new caps. The five reserves were, likewise, to be first timers. A further five out of the twenty have to be in the "not fired in the Match more than once before" category. (I now realise why SJ Pattinson was selected when he was still only an undergraduate). I was also warned that I must make sure that all my team were English Twenty Club members and had entered for the Club's championship. (So that explains why, in 1958 during his first Imperial Meeting, SJ Pattinson was dragged along to the Club by Chris Belk and made to pay up his ten shillings).

I felt that these points were not fully understood by potential team members and so e-mails and yearbook inserts were drafted and sent out. "The England National Team has never been selected by application." was one comment, but I did not want anyone to slip through the net without being given a chance. It was not until later that I realised one of the advantages of choosing James. He actually understands the NRA computing system and can tame the fiery, but obliging, Bill Richards in the Stats Office. I did not want to pick my team by computer, but it does do a good job in pointing out possible candidates that may be coming out of the woodwork. I remember admiring a previous National Captain, who spotted a Old Uppinghamian of quite mature years and gave him a place. — I will not divulge the name, but he is father of twins.

The computer is good at spotting individuals shooting well in the individual competitions, but it does not indicate their performance in coached team matches. This is where one has to keep one's eyes and ears open to find out good team members. I did not take part in the Grand Aggregate in order to be able to go around looking at how people actually shoot. I do not believe you can have a person in the team who takes forty seconds to get a shot away. It was difficult for me to do this incognito from my buggy, but I suppose being able to perform under the gaze of the Captain of England is a useful asset!

We tried out team performance at Bisley in May, when we fired against the RAF and other countries. The "getting to know" aspect of this match was almost more important than the fact that we won. It is essential that team members support each other and also check that their kit is properly prepared. Bent sights do not fire straight. (N.B. Richard!)

It was off to Barry Budden in June. Carnoustie golf balls were whizzing by, a few yards to our left, as we took part in the Scottish Open Meeting. The Lawrence Match proved a real tester of team coaching, nerve and skill. Scores were tied after the first ranges but, thanks to Les Wicker's calm organisation, we held it together. It was still a tie at the end, but we won by one "V" in three hundred and sixty shots. I like to think that this is why the 2007 GB World Championship set so much emphasis on their X count during their outstanding victories in Canada and the USA.

At the NRA Meeting, the Scots were amused to see that the English were calling me "Sir". Coaches, firers and reserves had to be picked. County Captains were invited to put forward names that may have slipped by. Scorebooks were examined for the flatness of their elevation graphs. Were the candidates reliable team shooters? All this boiled down to the final team that had seven

new caps in the twenty and where eight out of the thirty-three in the team photo were Old Uppinghamians.

And so to Thursday 26th July 2007.

1pm: Pep-talk in the English XX: "There's only one shot that counts this afternoon and that is the next shot......" I think there have been a few Uppingham pupils who have heard that before!

2pm: 300 yards, Range 12: the wind quite fresh and buffeting, some nerves, but no real disasters. The organisation seemed to be up to the mark and the old hands were encouraging the young.

3pm: 500 vards: what a transformation! Monsoon! Wind, rain, all hell let loose! Yet the firers kept their concentration and their wet weather drills intact. The butt party had their problems with soggy targets and pulverised patches. "Message fours?", "Message sevens?". Two bull's-eyes were lost. The Scots were gaining ground. The Chief Range Officer offered to "pull the plug", but no captain could be expected to volunteer to lose.



4pm: We soldiered on to 600 yards. The rain had stopped; another quick pep-talk; "I am told it's tight butwe can do it!" The sun came out, straight into our sodden sights and watery eyes. James, Nick, coaches and all in support held the team together despite a further crop of message fours, blistering radios, and an unsettled range officer. There was very little time to go when an Old Epsomian had to adopt traditional Uppinghamian tactics: "You have two targets. Fire alternate shots at each without waiting for the previous shot to be marked." We finished with seconds to spare.

"It is a good thing that I practised snap-shooting at school" was Paul Kent's comment after scoring 34 out of 35!

WE WON!! Four points in it. England's 100th victory in the match series.

"England, three cheers for Scotland, Ireland and Wales. Hip hip HURRAY....!!!"

And now: it's 2008. Jeanie, my wife, and I have Graeme Clarke's lovely album of photos to remind us of the great day. It is a testament to the



team coping with nigh-on impossible conditions and to a year's support from Jeanie, James and many, many others that enabled me to fulfil the honour that was bestowed upon me by my country. I am, forever, grateful to them all.

RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

- 1. **THE CLUB** shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. **THE OBJECTS** of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. **MEMBERSHIP**. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
- (D) Non-Shooting Member: Any Old Uppinghamian who wishes to join the club but does not fulfill the requirement set out in (B).

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.

- 4. **SUBSCRIPTIONS**. Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year, which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
- 5. **THE INCOMÉ** and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- PROPER BOOKS of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. **THE OFFI CERS** of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.

- 8. **THE PRESIDENT** of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
- 9. **MEMBERS** will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. **THE RULES** of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
