## **REVIEW OF 2009 by Gareth Morris**

Although 2009 did not bring many team trophies, Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club teams placed well in a number of matches and it was another good season for Uppingham Veterans shooting individually.

In April the club held a guest day where members of the club, their friends and family joined some current pupils to enjoy a mix of shooting activities and a dinner at Bisley - the home of shooting. As well as the traditional target rifle events, participants were able to have a go at black powder pistol, gallery rifle, shotgun and match rifle shot at 1000 yards.

The first match of the year also took place in April, with an Uppingham Veterans team competing in the Purple's Match at Bisley. Despite the team only having been assembled at the last minute, UVRC took a very respectable 5<sup>th</sup> place with a score of 1169.137 ex 1200.240 in a match that was dominated by difficult winds at 500 and 600 yards. Only 8 points and 2 v's behind the might of Surrey, it was a good start to the 2009 season. James Watson's 150 was the best of three on the day to win the individual trophy and Simon Belither as his coach won the Coaches salver.

Meanwhile, the school had a mixed training year in the lead up to the Imperial Meeting. Although the small-bore range reopened in April, full-bore range access remained a serious issue. The school managed a couple of trips down to Bisley, but trips of 110 miles each way are not sustainable on a regular basis. Unfortunately, practices at Beckingham Ranges were repeatedly cancelled at short notice and overtures to Oundle for access to Elmington Range have been unsuccessful to date.

Suffering slightly from the lack of range time, the school meeting represented a great opportunity to get some intensive match practice before the Ashburton on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July. In the Iveagh match, two of the school made the top hundred: Cadet A. McFadyen took 29<sup>th</sup> with a score of 34.3 and Cadet Oliver Kember took 98<sup>th</sup> with 33.3 at 500 yards.

In the Ashburton itself, Uppingham managed 15<sup>th</sup> place out of 42 schools, with a score of 717.33. Uppingham's detailed scores are listed below:

A. Lakhani shot the Spencer Mellish and was 15th out of 40 cadets with a score of 45.4.

The winning team, Gresham's school in Norfolk, had a score of 794.59 and was coached by Freddie Grounds of Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club. As noted in the recent NRA journal Freddie now joins fellow Uppingham Veteran Simon Pattinson in the very exclusive club of shooting masters with Ashburton wins at more than one school.

Following the Ashburton on the final Thursday of the schools meeting, the Veteran's match is a traditional occasion for the former members of teams and one-time shooters to join the Bisley regulars for a shoot at 500 yards which often lasts well into the evening.

Uppingham usually enjoy a high turnout and 2009 was no exception, with five teams representing the club in a hard-fought match. The A Team took second place, having dropped a single point in five shoots; however the B and C teams did not fare quite so well.

The break-down of scores has been misplaced. If anyone has the details, please let us have them so we can publish them next year for the record.

In the Match rifle competitions which take place at the same time as the schools meeting, Messrs. Pizer and Hinchliffe ensured that the club was represented, with Nick Hinchliffe finishing 38<sup>th</sup> in the Hopton.

With the schools meeting over, the target rifle portion of the Imperial Meeting could begin in earnest. The Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club continued the strong history of its members placing highly in individual competitions and international representation.

Uppingham Veterans placed in the top ten in no fewer than 26 competitions. Antony Ringer won the Donegall and the second stage of Her Majesty the Queens' Prize, as well as placing in the top 10 in 7 other competitions. Alex Williams won the Duke of Cambridge with an outstanding score of 50.9 out of a possible 50.10, ahead of James Watson in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. James also won the OTF Long Range aggregate and was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Volunteer Force and had a further 6 top 10 placings. Others with top 10 placings included John Webster (4), Isobel Stephenson (1 – see below), Gareth Morris (1) and John Dorrington-Ward (1), 2nd in the Stickledown competition.

Special mention should be made of Isobel Stephenson, one of our younger members, who had a superb meeting. As well as taking top "O" class honours (and 6<sup>th</sup> place overall) in the Daily Mail competition, she also represented a significant number of winning teams: the Territorial Army team in the Inter-Services Long Range match, Great Britain in the under 25s match, England in the National Match and Birmingham University in the Universities' Long Range match.

In addition to second place in the Public Schools Veterans Match, Uppingham Veterans took 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Steward ahead of Manydown and Gifford-Grant, Wandsworth White. The team comprised Antony Ringer, Alex Williams, John Webster and Isobel Stephenson. Antony also won the Goble Memorial Trophy for the top score in the Steward. In the other team matches, Uppingham were 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Bank of England, 5<sup>th</sup> in the Rifle Clubs 7<sup>th</sup> in the Marlingham, 8<sup>th</sup> in the Astor and 9<sup>th</sup> in the Belgian.

Once again, a significant number of our members were members of national and international representative teams. Gareth Morris and Chris Watson represented Wales in the National and Mackinnon matches, competing against Antony Ringer who shot for England in both. Antony was joined in the National match by Isobel Stephenson, winning her first England National badge, and Nick Hinchliffe, the England team's main coach, winning his 15<sup>th</sup>, and in the Mackinnon Match by John Webster as a reserve. Antony was also selected to shoot for Great Britain in the Kolapore match, which they won by more than a point a man under the considered leadership of Robin Pizer, the GB Team Captain for the 2009 Kolapore Match.

With the Commonwealth Games and World Long Range Championships looming in 2010 and 2011, Uppingham Veterans are continuing to represent Great Britain and the home nations. Chris and James Watson both represented Great Britain in team matches during the 2010 tour to New Zealand with Chris top-scoring in both matches. Gareth Morris won the Commonwealth Games trials for Wales in 2009 and is awaiting confirmation of selection for the 2010 Games in Delhi. Club members are also members of the Palma training squad for the 2011 World Long range Championships in Brisbane, Australia. In

addition to John Webster, the team captain, and James Watson, Adjutant, Nick Hinchliffe, Gareth Morris, Chris Watson and Alex Williams remain in the running for a place on the team.

Gareth Morris has volunteered to accept responsibility for writing the review of the year's shooting to assist James in the production of the annual report.

## 6. TREASURER'S REPORT

The accounts, printed in the Club Report, have been inspected by a qualified accountant and were presented by the Honorary Treasurer. # **CLUB REPORT**

Please remember to inform the Honorary Secretary of any change of address

As the information held is used only for production of the Annual Report, the Club is not required to register under the Data Protection Act. The report is now also published in pdf format on the OU section of the school website – the member list, addresses and contact details of members are not included in that version.

#### RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

- 1. **THE CLUB** shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. **THE OBJECTS** of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. **MEMBERSHIP**. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
- (D) Non-Shooting Member: Any Old Uppinghamian who wishes to join the club but does not fulfill the requirement set out in (B).

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.

- 4. **SUBSCRIPTIONS**. Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year, which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
- 5. THE INCOME and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- 6. **PROPER BOOKS** of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. **THE OFFICERS** of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.

- 8. **THE PRESIDENT** of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
- 9. **MEMBERS** will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. **THE RULES** of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club
