**REVIEW OF 2012 by Gareth Morris**

The 2012 season showed promise for the future from the school team, who returned to competing in the Ashburton after a two-year hiatus after much hard work by the shooting master and RSM. There were also some great individual and team results from club members, with several competitions won and international teams represented. Looking forward to 2013, club members have again been picked to represent GB at a senior level and there are prospects for the 2014 Commonwealth Games.

By way of a start to the 2012 season, the club and school held a smallbore match at the refurbished school range, with a dinner later for those able to stay on into the evening. Eleven OUs and several of their partners managed to make it to Uppingham on a very cold and damp Saturday in March.

The club team beat the school team by a narrow margin in the teams match.

The individual top score went to David Mathieson, who counted out Ben Bullard by a single centre.

During the Match Rifle phase at the start of the Imperial Meeting, **Nick Hinchliffe** and **Robin Pizer** planned to try their hand in the Hopton, while **John Webster** and **James Watson** had in mind taking on the challenge of shooting match rifle distances with target rifles and issued ammunition. Nick managed a reasonable start with a 74.8 in the any rifle extras before having to retire from the meeting on health grounds. Your correspondent is relieved to report that, following treatment, Nick was recently spotted on Stickledown beating the England team into shape during the European Long Range Championships. Webbie took 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the RWS Aggregate.

After a two year absence from the main Ashburton Vllls competition, it was a delight to see the school team return with a full complement and compete against the other major shooting schools. Both Kevin Gladding and the RSM have both put a significant amount of hard work into making this happen, and it is through these future OUs that our membership will be refreshed. One hopes that the return to the main cadet competition can be maintained in 2013 and beyond.

Several of the school team featured well in the individual cadet events: **Cpl. S Hunti ng** was 41<sup>st</sup> in the Cadet Monday Aggregate and 5<sup>th</sup> in the Spencer Mellish; **Cpl M. Ho rrel** was 25<sup>th</sup> in the Cadet Rifle Aggregate, 12<sup>th</sup> in the Cadet Tuesday Aggregate and 9<sup>th</sup> in the Victoria Tankard; **Sgt. O. Crump** was 40<sup>th</sup> in the Wellington; and **LCpl H. Walker** was 41<sup>st</sup> in the Wellington. **Cdt. O. Kember** also made the top hundred in several competitions.

The Public Schools' Veterans Match was held at 500 yards on Century Range after the conclusion of the Ashburton in solid rain which continued unabated throughout the shoot. Fortunately, a borrowed gazebo and numerous umbrellas kept the worst off rifles and kit, and the veterans' teams were able to make some reasonable scores. The "A" team matched their 2011 gunscore and vee count but were only able to take second place, a point behind OGRE. The "B" and "C" teams managed creditable places, despite their scoresheets being marred by an unexpected outer and miss, respectively.

While the 2012 July weather unfortunately replicated 2011's sullen cold and showers, OUs coped well with the conditions to produce a number of superb individual results during the most anticipated phase of the Imperial Meeting, with **James Watson's** stunning 4<sup>th</sup> place in the Grand Aggregate foremost; although **Gaz Morris'** outright wins in both the first and second stages of HM Queen's Prize are surely a close second. In addition to a number of individual podium performances by members of the club, there is continued representation at the highest levels in team shooting.

As has become standard, several of the club's members were picked to represent the home nations and GB in the international matches during the Imperial Meeting. **James Watson** top scored for the winning England team in the National Match, making an outstanding 105.19, while **Chris Watson** and **Gaz Morris** both shot for Wales. James was joined by **Ant Ringer** in the England team selection for the Mackinnon Match, with Chris and Gaz again being picked for Wales.

**James Watson** was also picked to shoot for Great Britain in the Kolapore Cup, with **Gaz Morris** being picked as shooting reserve. James had the fine distinction of contributing to GB's winning and record-breaking score of 1199.201, but also the mild embarrassment of being the only shooter on the team to drop a point; however the coach and plotter are reported to have both taken at least partial responsibility for the 4 o'clock inner, which missed the line by only a few millimetres.

Looking forward to 2013, four OUs will be travelling to the West Indies with the Great Britain Rifle Team: **Jonathan Hull**, **Gaz Morris**, **John Webster** and **Chris Watson**. The team will spend nearly four weeks shooting in Jamaica, Guyana, Trinidad and Barbados in April/May next year. Congratulations to Jon on his first GB cap.

**James Watson** will be leading the England team as Captain to South Africa in April with **Emma Cannings** his Adjutant. **Nick Hinchliffe** has been selected as the main coach and **Ant Ringer** along with **Alex Williams** are shooting members of the team.

Your correspondent, writing this while sitting in Amsterdam's Schiphol airport departures lounge watching Bradley Wiggins (not an OU) give his all in the time trial event, wonders what fullbore at the Olympics might be like. Sadly the sport is unlikely ever to make a reappearance owing to the lack of media interest, lack of money and perceived difficulty of finding or building ranges; however with the Commonwealth Games being the only major multi-sport event to include fullbore shooting, dare we suspect that a few of the membership may have their eyes on next year's trials for England and Wales for their Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games Teams? Watch this space over the next 12 months.

The **Lucas** - awarded to the School whose Veterans A team and Ashburton team together make the highest aggregate score.

The **Marlingham Trophy** - open to any number of teams of five former or present pupils shooting the NRA Grand Aggregate of the current year.

The **Belgian, Steward, Rifle Clubs** and the **Bank of England** - open to teams from clubs affiliated to the NRA, and shot concurrently with individual events in the Imperial meeting.

## RULES OF THE UPPINGHAM VETERANS RIFLE CLUB

1. **THE CLUB** shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
  2. **THE OBJECTS** of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
  3. **MEMBERSHIP.** Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
    - (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
    - (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
    - (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
    - (D) Non-Shooting Member: Any Old Uppinghamian who wishes to join the club but does not fulfill the requirement set out in (B).

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.
  4. **SUBSCRIPTIONS.** Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year (£20 from 2014), which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
  5. **THE INCOME** and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
  6. **PROPER BOOKS** of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
  7. **THE OFFICERS** of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Schools Liaison Officer, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.
- There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.
8. **THE PRESIDENT** of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
  9. **MEMBERS** will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
  10. **THE RULES** of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club
