#### Review of 2013 by Gareth Morris

In 2013 the club has again shown that its members can compete at the very highest levels in both individual competitions and team matches. OUs have shot in international matches and toured abroad for England, Wales and GB teams. OUs have won or placed highly in numerous international competitions. OUs will be shooting at the 2014 Com monwealth Games. Despite these facts, the increased cost of shooting and competing interests are making it hard for all clubs to maintain the inflow of youthful talent. Currently, the effects of this phenomenon on our club are limited to an increasing issue of recruiting "O" and "T" class shooters to shoot for class-restricted teams in the Imperial Meeting, and us only fielding three full teams in the Public Schools' Veterans' Match; however your faithful correspondent cannot help but feel that this situation will worsen over the next few years. The NRA is apparently looking into the issue; however your faithful correspondent suspects that tinkering around the edges will not be enough.

The early-season smallbore match between the club and the s chool has now become an annual event much enjoyed by OUs and pupils alike. Despite the wet and windy weather, a good number of OUs made the trek to Uppingham. The club team beat the school team in the teams match despite some good scores by the pupils.

The detailed scores have unfortunately been lost so if anyone has a copy we would appreciate receiving them for our records.

A month later, James Watson (L88) led an England team to compete in South Africa. The team of twenty-one contained four other OUs: Emma Cannings (L93), Alex Williams (Fgh92) Ant Ringer (B79) and Chris Belk (WB51). England was narrowly beaten into second place by South Africa, a mere 2 points (out of 1800) ahead with the USA trailing England by a single point — one of the c losest international matches in history.

As this team returned, a GB team headed out to the West Indies with members including Jonathan Hull (F74), Gaz Morris (L89) and Chris Watson – John Webster (C70) had been selected but was unable to travel. The team won the Australia Match by a significant margin with Chris Watson top scoring in the match.

A small number of O Us entered for events in the match rifle meeting: **Robin Pizer** entered the Hopton, while **James Watson** and **John Webster** tried their luck at match rifle distances using their target rifles and RUAG ammunition in the RWS Aggregate.

The school managed to field a full team for the Ashburton for the second year running, but suffered slightly from the lack of experience of the youthful cohort. The club is grateful for all of the hard work that Kevin Gladding and the RS M have put into the school team. The school came 21<sup>st</sup> (from 22 schools entering) in the Ashburton:

The Donegall Badge was awarded to **Peter Mayne** and **Simon Pattinson** was slightly embarrassed to be present with his own P attinson Trophy for his superb 50.7; however both were extremely popular winners with the members of the club, receiving loud applause when the results were announced.

The target rifle part of the meeting continued to be blessed with continuous hot and sunny weather; although a suspected batch of soft brass cases combined with the high temperatures resulted in frequent blown primers. The offending batch of ammunition was withdrawn and replaced with the same batch as used in 2012's meeting. Despite this issue, scores were of a very high standard throughout all nine days of the tar get rifle meeting. Gaz Morris was highest OU in both the G rand Aggregate in 5<sup>th</sup> place and in the final of the St. George's Challenge Vase in 9<sup>th</sup> place. Emma Cannings shot the top score in the final of H.M. Queen's Prize, a superlative 149.17, to take 5<sup>th</sup> place when the scores from the 2<sup>nd</sup> stage were taken into account.

A core of the club's more experienced members have become regular members of the home nations' teams and the GB team in international matches during the Imperial Meeting.

In the National Match at short range **James Watson** shot for England, while **Gaz Morris** and **Chris Watson** again shot for Wales. **Gaz Morris**' score of 105.16 was the highest on his team and the second highest on the range. In the Mackinnon match at long range, **John Webster** captained England and **James Watson** performed as his adjutant while **Ant Ringer** was the only OU in a shooting role. **Gaz Morris** and **Chris Watson** both shot for Wales. **Chris Watson's** score of 99.11 ex 100.20 was the top tally for Wales and one of the highest on Stickledown.

**James Watson** and **Gaz Morris** were both delighted to be selected to shoot for Great Britain in the Kolapore match. Both rewarded the captain's trust in them by returning maximum scores of 150 ex 150, the only two such scores on the team . GB beat's econd-placed Australia by a margin of 16 points.

Looking forward to 2014, club members will again represent the home nations and Great Britain in the most prestigious events: **Gaz Morris** and **Chris Watson** will both be representing Wales at the

Commonwealth Games in Glasgow. Trials for the 2015 Palma, which will be held at Camp Perry in Ohio, are underway with several OUs in attendance.

Practice for the expected African heat took place on two weekends in February and March, when the temperature at Bisley struggled to beat zero and it snowed at least twice. Gloves on both hands (of any

colour) were essential. Emma's ex-military ferocity took the form of compulsory warm-up runs, which Chris Belk (75) managed to avoid by hiding behind a tree till the others got back. Of course, all UVRC members are already well hardened in their youth by the Siberian jet-stream which usually goes through Uppingham, but even our dedicated captain relented by shortening the practice programme.



The team departed on April Fools' Day, hoping that was not prophetic. Luckily the journey out was uneventful, though on the way back one carload lost its way to the airport and nearly had to stay indefinitely in SA, which they were quite tempted to do gi ven the quality and quantity of meat and wine and hospitality available.

Of course (?), meat and wine were not the only reasons we were there. James was determined to defeat the locals on their home territory, and the individual matches were treated throughout as tests for team selection. His task was not helped by the fact that the B loemfontein wind tends to be exceptionally difficult for the uncoached and even the coaches; but there are also a number of subsidiary team matches which ironed out some of the excuses. Suffice it to say that of the UV RC members only James and Ant made it to shoot in the flagship Protea match at the end of the week, Chris Belk being made temporary captain for that occasion as consolation for his earlier inaccuracies (should he have done the run after all??). Emma and Alex

formed part of the well-organised coaching/plotting That squad. Protea match (shot at 300, 600 and 900 metres) was exceptionally exciting up to the last shot, with England beating USA by 1 point and losing to South Africa by only 2. The team justified performance James' decision some team members should both coach and shoot, which nowadays is rare in international matches (he did both himself and s cored 148 though was a bit tired afterwards).



England also beat USA in the other main international match (RSA at 800 and 900), though lost that one to SA by rather more.



The main stars in individual matches were Parag Patel, who won the overall SA championship (State President plus Grand) and 3 other competitions, and Jon Underwood, who won one and obtained Merits (= prize lists) in every available event. Ant Ringer scored 150 in the State President 2nd stage to come third, and all UVRC's qualified for the State President Final (equivalent of Queens 100). That was won by Arno Haasbroek with 297. Parag came 4th and Glyn Barnett 9th, but only two others in the team (Paul Kent and Kelvin Ramsey) were in the top 30. (UVRC placings - Chris 35, Ant 52, Emma 55, James 76, Alex 81). Those South Africans are really quite good, especially when at home, and what is more they only require a 500 gram trigger pressure, though our team preferred to c ontinue with the triggers they were used to.

Back on the meat & wine, many evenings were very happily spent and extended by some well into the following day. On one evening we got tickets to the local first class rugby match in their amazing stadium, due to the visiting team staying in our hotel. Dinner-time prizegivings do tend to drag a bit, but a bit of cabaret livened up one of those as K. Ramsey (well over 19) was announced as a winner and proudly collected his prize, only to have to give it back as it turned out to be a prize for under-19s won by a girl called Kate.

#### Rules of The Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club

- 1. THE CLUB shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
- 2. **THE OBJECTS** of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
- 3. **MEMBERSHIP**. Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
- (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
- (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
- (D) Non-Shooting Member: Any Old Uppinghamian who wishes to join the club but does not fulfill the requirement set out in (B).

Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.

- 4. **SUBSCRIPTIONS**. Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year (£20 from 2014), which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
- 5. THE INCOME and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
- 6. **PROPER BOOKS** of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
- 7. **THE OFFICERS** of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Schools Liaison Officer, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.

- 8. **THE PRESIDENT** of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
- 9. **MEMBERS** will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
- 10. **THE RULES** of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
