The Watson Rose bowl was awarded to Alistair Milmore and the Ferrand Trophy was awarded to Theodore Barclay School Shooting Ties awarded to the new students in the squad, Alistair Milmore, Oliver Hayworth, Archie Simpson, Ross Carmichael and Cameron Burgess.

I believe we are in good shape considering Oakham only managed a team of 5 and Oundle for the first time ever did not bring a team to the Schools meeting at all.

The Veteran's match followed on from the Ashburton on a warm sunny evening. Sixteen OU's were available and three teams were entered, with the experienced shooters coaching and assisting the less so. This was **Ben Yates'** first year as secretary and **Emma Cannings** kindly stood in as captain for **Jonathan Hull**, who was unavailable. The Donegall Badge was awarded to **George Christopherson** and the Simon Pattinson Trophy was won by **Emma Cannings**.

The TR Meeting was good for UVRC members across the board. Of the various UVRC teams entering aggregate matches, the only top ten place was 4th in the **Marlingham**, but a number of individuals did very well. In the **Grand Aggregate** we had four in the top 100 (**Gaz Morris** 14th, **Simon Osmond** 31st, **James Watson** 42nd, **Chris Watson** 59th) and seven in the top 200. In the final stages of the big competitions we were represented in the **St George's Challenge Vase** by **Simon Osmond** (13<sup>th</sup>), **Chris Watson** (14<sup>th</sup>) and **Gaz Morris** (37<sup>th</sup>). There were 6 OU's in **HM Queens Final** and **Chris Watson** came a very close 3<sup>rd</sup> just four long range V bulls behind the runner-up. Other finalists were **Gaz Morris** (52<sup>nd</sup>), **Simon Osmond** (58<sup>th</sup>), **James Watson** (63<sup>rd</sup>), **Emma Cannings** (74<sup>th</sup>), and **Freddie Grounds** (79<sup>th</sup>).

Other notable OU individual results included:

**Simon Osmond** 1st in the Prince of Wales, 6<sup>th</sup> = in the Donaldson Memorial Final and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Marjorie Keir Aggregate. Simon also won the X class Fulton Pairs (with a non-OU partner!).

**Ant Ringer** 1<sup>st</sup> in the Queen's Consolation, 6<sup>th</sup> = in the Donaldson Memorial Final, 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Tucker Aggregate and 4<sup>th</sup> in the Friday Aggregate.

**Gaz Morris** 1<sup>st</sup> in the Weekend Aggregate, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Sunday Aggregate, 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Century Aggregate, 4<sup>th</sup> in the Fulton and Tucker Aggregates.,

**Chris Watson** 1st in the Donaldson Memorial Final, and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Short Range Aggregate.

**James Watson** 1<sup>st</sup> in the Times, 1<sup>st</sup> in the Volunteer Force, 9<sup>th</sup> in the Admiral Hutton, 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Friday and Howcroft Newspaper Aggregates.

The club championship was won by **Chris Watson** whose combined scores in the three elements was 1135.140. **Gaz** scored 1134.141 and **Simon** 1132.130, so a very close result after three outstanding all-round performances.

In the international competitions, The National Match produced a win for Wales for the very first time with **Gaz Morris** and **Chris Watson** both getting 105's. **Simon Osmond** was the only OU to shoot for England in the National, and **James Watson** the sole UVRC member in England's McKinnon team. **Gaz** and **Chris** both shot for Wales in The McKinnon, and **Gaz** represented GB in The Kolopore.

Harold Granville Terence Payne Doyne-Ditmas or Hal as he was simply known to the club, (pictured on the right as a member of the school shooting team) left Uppingham in 1948 having been in the School Shooting VIII, he then spent 3 years in the Royal Horse Artillery before going to Cambridge where he attained a Half-Blue and captained the Cambridge team in 1954.

He was an exemplary shot and as one might expect, he accrued an enviable list of individual shooting successes, such as being a Queens Prize finalist during Imperial Meetings on 4 occasions in 1951, 1952, 1955 and 1957; winning the Wimbledon in 1952, and the Saturday Aggregate in 1954.

He shot for the Territorial and Regular Army as well as for England and Great Britain with caps won between 1951 and 1961 in the Australia (Empire), National and Mackinnon matches. Hal was a member of the GB tours to Canada in 1952 and Australia & New Zealand in 1958. Full details of his representations are listed in the historical records elsewhere in the club report.



In 1988 he was awarded Companion of the Order of the Bath - CB - following completion of various posts in the MoD (as an active M15 intelligence and counter-intelligence officer for many years) and at a very senior Government level. These postings included Kuala Lumpur 1958-60, USA, Moscow 1969-71 the Cabinet Office 1977-79, Director of Intelligence for N Ireland, Director of Transport Security, Dept. of Transport 1990-95 and as a "Security consultant" from 1995 until retirement.

Hal supported the UVRC as Captain 1963-4 and as President 1979-81 playing an active role on the Exec Committee until relatively recently. His last PS Veterans match shoot for UVRC was in 2004.

Chris Belk provided the following comment on of his memory of Hal:

"To the mind of a 14 year old attending Uppingham Easter Bisley for his first ever go with a .303, in March 1952, Hal D- D was an almost impossibly romantic figure. Riding a swashbuckling motorbike and exuding the handsome confidence of a Cambridge half-blue, Hal had volunteered to help introduce us lower forms of life to the magic of Bisley. In the course of those few days I remember specially my first ever shoot on Stickledown. Coached with exemplary kindness by Hal at 900 yards I achieved 34/35. I had got the bug. At the Imperial meeting that July I saw the final run of the Bisley Bullet train, with Hal and his CURA comrades riding on the engine as it arrived in the camp. Even more romantic - only later did I find out that Hal did indeed become something in the secret service, but that was only to be expected. He finished I believe as secretary to the Joint Security Committee - possibly not quite M but pretty nearly. Sadly they don't make English gentlemen quite the same these days. The peace in which I pray he is resting will I expect be more exciting than the usual image."

### **RSM Peter Warren – by Simon Pattinson**

Some of you may have already seen my obituary for Peter in the 2015/16 OU magazine (Page17). I am now expanding on what I said then.

If ever one needed the ideal right-hand man, one only had to look to Peter. He had the cheerful ability to foresee problems and to come up with just the right solution wherever possible. If it wasn't possible, he merely bypassed it. He was a "can do" man.

Schools' shooting lurched from crisis to crisis during his time with us at Uppingham. For instance: After 303 ammunition had finally run out, the replacement Cadet 7.62 military rifles were suddenly not deemed suitable/safe for cadets. This did seem quite a problem! However, the Cadet 5.56, SA 80 rifle was on the way. Somehow, Uppingham was one of the first schools to get their allocation of the rifle. I well remember the groan of "How did they fix it?" that went around the Bisley Meeting. I don't know exactly how it happened; but I do know who was responsible! This resulted in Peter accompanying me, on the train, to a top brass meeting in London to sort out new competitions that would suit the little rifle. Amongst other things we worked out "on the back of an envelope" was how to convert existing Bisley targets to the "tin hat" type.

The new Snap and Marling needed a military electric target range, but who was qualified to take on this task? Shooters from all schools will remember Peter filling this role at Pirbright on behalf of the NRA. He ran these competitions himself for many years.

Back at school, he used his skills to benefit shooting in all sorts of ways. He managed to get us the right kit, even ammunition, well above the standard allocation, seemed to appear. Much of this was down to the way he realised that it was people and not paperwork that really mattered. He sought out the right people and, through his cheerful approach, they did their best for us. We found ourselves using surplus range space alongside military units. Even the range wardens were prepared to help us.

One thing that Peter didn't bring to Uppingham from his army career was the "Gung ho", bullet headedness that can be found in the army. He was sensitive to the nervousness of young shooters. He recognised their marksmanship skills, which he helped them to develop through many sessions in the mini range. In team matches, it was Peter who introduced "the chair" for the next firer to sit on and get settled down before their turn on the firing point.

Enough from me. Many of you will have your own memories of Peter; perhaps we can still share them around as a way of saying "thank you" for everything that he did for so many of us. We all owe him so much.

The NRA operates a handicapping system for most competitions in the Imperial Meeting. Despite its disadvantages in reducing the likelihood of appearing in a prize list, the top class of 'X' is eagerly sought, the second is class 'A'. Beginners are class 'T' and all others class 'O'.

The NRA 'X' class is earned by any competitor who, in any of the previous three years, has been placed in the top 50 in HM the Queen's Prize, the St George's Challenge Vase, or the NRA Grand Aggregate. The NRA 'A' class is earned by any competitor who, in any of the previous three years, has been placed in the second 50 in HM the Queen's Prize or the St George's Challenge Vase, or placed between 51st and 200th in the NRA Grand Aggregate. The members of UVRC who are qualified to shoot in Class 'X' or Class 'A' for 2015 are listed below, together with the number of competitions in which they qualified:

## Rules of The Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club

1. **THE CLUB** shall be called the Uppingham Veterans Rifle Club.
2. **THE OBJECTS** of the Club shall be the promotion and encouragement of target shooting with rifles, and the training of Old Uppinghamians and pupils of Uppingham School in marksmanship and the use of rifles, in the interest of the better defence of the United Kingdom.
3. **MEMBERSHIP.** Any Uppinghamian, being a member of the Uppingham Association, shall be eligible for election as a member:
  - (A) Probationary Member: Before attaining full membership members must undergo a probationary period of six months and satisfy the Executive Committee as to their suitability with particular regard to safety and security in the handling of firearms and ammunition. Applicants shall be proposed by a current ordinary member and by one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be the master in charge of shooting during the time they were at school and who gave them proper instruction on safety of firearms. Probationary members may not vote at the Annual General Meeting. A probationary member will not pay a subscription until he or she becomes an ordinary member.
  - (B) Ordinary Member: A person who has satisfactorily completed a period of probationary membership may become an ordinary member. So too may a person who is already a member of a Home Office Approved Club or holds a Firearm Certificate authorising possession of a rifle, subject to satisfactory references from a current club member and one other person who knows the applicant personally. Usually this will be an official of the applicant's previous rifle club. All ordinary members will be approved at a meeting of the Executive Committee.
  - (C) Honorary Member: Any person who has rendered service to shooting either at Uppingham or among Uppinghamians may be proposed to the Annual General meeting as an honorary member by the Executive Committee. Such persons may only participate in the Club's shooting events if they fulfil the requirement for ordinary membership in (B) above. The Executive Committee may also elect to 4-year honorary membership pupils who have recently left Uppingham School and have satisfactorily completed six months' probationary membership.
  - (D) Non-Shooting Member: Any Old Uppinghamian who wishes to join the club but does not fulfill the requirement set out in (B).
- Any person who has ever been refused the grant of a firearm certificate shall be ineligible for election to any class of membership of the Club.
4. **SUBSCRIPTIONS.** Ordinary members shall pay £15 a year (£20 from 2014), which shall be due on March 1st in each year, or in the case of a new member after the date of his or her election. Any member whose subscription is still unpaid by December 1st of the current year shall be sent a reminder to his or her last known address; if payment is still not made by March 1st following, the person concerned shall cease to be a member of the club, whether or not he or she had received this reminder. The Honorary Secretary shall report to the next Annual General Meeting which members have been removed from the Roll under this clause. A member so removed from the Roll may rejoin on payment of one years' back subscription. A member who resigns may rejoin subsequently without back payment provided his or her subscription is paid up at the time of his or her resignation. Life members shall pay a single payment of fifty times the current annual subscription rate (i.e. £750).
5. **THE INCOME** and property of the Club whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the aforesaid objects of the Club and if on a winding up or dissolution of the Club there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid or distributed among the members of the Club but shall be given or transferred to some charitable association or object, such association or object to be determined by the members of the Club at or before the time of dissolution.
6. **PROPER BOOKS** of account with respect to the affairs of the Club shall be kept. Accounts inspected by a qualified independent accountant shall be published annually before the Annual General Meeting for agreement of the members.
7. **THE OFFICERS** of the Club shall consist of a President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Captain, Under 25 Captain, Schools Liaison Officer, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer with three elected members, the Master in charge of shooting at the School, and any Past Presidents still living shall collectively form the Executive Committee, by whom the Club and its property shall be managed. The Executive Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the full members of the Club not more than two such members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the running of the club and have unrestricted power of investment of any financial surplus for the Club's benefit. The Executive Committee has power to deal with anything not provided for in these rules.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club after the Veterans Match at Bisley each year, at which the officers and members of the above Committee shall be elected to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting. At the same meeting the year's accounts of the Club shall be submitted, and also any report which the Executive Committee may desire to present to the Meeting.
8. **THE PRESIDENT** of the Club shall be elected for a period not exceeding three years after which time he or she shall be ineligible to hold that office for the next three years. The President shall be elected in recognition of long and outstanding service to the Club.
9. **MEMBERS** will be entitled to wear the Club's colours.
10. **THE RULES** of the Club may be added to, altered or amended by a clear majority of those voting at any Annual or other General Meeting of members of the Club.
